Routines and Expectations

- At the start of the school day, children will arrive through the school gates between 8:40am and 8:45am. At the end of the school day, children being collected will exit from the bottom of the playground, near the table tennis area.
- As safeguarding is so important, please ensure that you have informed the school office and staff on the door (before the end of the school day) of any unfamiliar adults that are not recognised by the class teacher who maybe picking up your child.
- As safety is our priority, if you would like to speak to the class teacher please ensure that you wait until all Year 4 children are dismissed at the end of the day.
- Children are welcome to bring a water and juice/squash bottle into school. However, **only water** is to be consumed within the classroom.
- P.E. days will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays.** On these days children will need to wear their PE kit. Please ensure that **earrings are removed** and **no jewellery is present**.
- Please ensure that ALL uniform, including PE is clearly labelled. (Please check - as sometimes labels wash out)
- Earrings need to be a plain stud.
- Owlet cards (badges) are available to download from the school's website.
- Please ensure that you order school dinners for the following week.

Reading at Mount Pleasant

Reading is at the heart of all we do. We endeavour to promote a love of reading throughout the school. 2026 is the National Year of Reading: this is a government-backed campaign to re-ignite passion and reading culture for EVERYONE. We all know that reading expands worlds, sharpens minds and fuels creativity but studies are showing that it is not being prioritised in day-to-day life. Children are exposed to a range of high quality texts and authors in Whole Class reading and they use them to expand their vocabulary and develop and broaden their comprehension skills in Whole Class Reading Sessions. We will also focus on developing Fluency and Reading for Pleasure and we want to encourage the children to read widely **and use their passions to inspire this. Your child will have a reading record to share and showcase their reading routine outside of school; it tracks your child's reading journey. We ask that parents (and where appropriate, children) write in these regularly.** Our magic number with reading is **20** – 20 minutes as often as possible. **Reading is a key skill and we firmly believe that children who read well, do well.**

Our Mount Pleasant Learning Adventures

We aim to provide a broad, balanced and exciting curriculum from Nursery to the end of Year 6. This includes ensuring our children have a wide range of experiences to enrich their learning both in and out of the classroom. Staff and curriculum leads have been working hard to ensure our evolving curriculum develops the skills and knowledge needed to create passionate and excited life-long learners. Following on from the success from last academic year, the children will focus on two Learning Adventures per year. Maths – Rapid Recall

Nut Free School

We would like to remind you of the following points to help minimise the risks for our children with serious allergies:
